LSE Grade Transcription

LSE sends Tufts two grades per course which Tufts averages 50/50 to produce a single grade:

- A class grade determined by the lecturer and based on an overall assessment of your work, including attendance, class participation (engagement and quality), presentations and marks received for essays and/or problem sets.
- An exam grade based solely on the marks you receive for the summative assessment (exam and/or assessed essays) at the end of the course.

If separated by a single grade band the higher grade will be used (e.g., if your grades are a B and a B+ the final grade will be a B+). For example, if a student is taking British Politics and earns LSE A/B+ it would be a Tufts grade of A- (50% A, 50% B+).

Each LSE course works the same way, whether it is half or full year.

If the course is a full year one, it will be listed twice on your Tufts transcript — British Politics I (Fall term) and British Politics II (Spring term). You will have only earned one grade (British Politics, Tufts Grade A-) and it will be the same for both Tufts semesters, fall and spring.

LSE converts numerical grades into letter ones as follows:

75+	A+
68-74	A
65-67	A-
60-64	B+
55-59	B
50-54	B-
45-49	C+
40-44	C
